#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Receive and file the following:

- 1) An update on the Old Car Buy Back Program for vehicles retired during the period of August 1, 2018 through September 30, 2018; and
- An update on the Woodsmoke Reduction Program for fireplace and stove replacement projects during the period of October 25, 2018 through December 1, 2018; and
- 3) Summary of the emission-reduction grant agreements approved by the Air Pollution Control Officer for the period of October 4, 2018 through December 5, 2018 in accordance with Board Resolution Number 09-14, including:
  - a. Santa Barbara City College EV Charging Station Infrastructure Program (Termination).

#### **DISCUSSION**:

Your Board expanded the authority of the Control Officer to issue grants for emission reduction projects up to \$150,000 provided your Board had authorized an overall umbrella program for each type of project. The attached summary sheets describe the grants approved since our last report. In addition, updated grant fund allocation reports by city for the District's Old Car Buy Back Program as well as the Woodsmoke Reduction Program are being provided.

# OLD CAR BUY BACK PROGRAM UPDATE


The District's Old Car Buy Back Program currently pays Santa Barbara County vehicle owners \$1,000 to voluntarily retire their fully legal and operational 1994 or older, light or medium duty car, truck, van, or SUV. On December 3, 2018, the District began accepting vehicles model year 1995 and older.

The three regional dismantlers earned \$250 for each vehicle that they helped retire. Currently, the total program cost is \$1,250 to retire a vehicle.

The program accelerates the improvement of air quality by removing high polluting vehicles from the road, quicker than normal vehicle attrition. Funding for the program is derived from DMV registration surcharge revenue and Carl Moyer Program funds.

\*For vehicles retired only from August 1, 2018 – September 30, 2018.




### Woodsmoke Reduction Program Update

This voluntary program is designed to help households replace a wood-burning uncertified stove, fireplace insert, or fireplace used as a primary source of heat with a cleaner-burning and more efficient device. Applicants who meet low-income eligibility requirements may qualify for an Enhanced Incentive Voucher of up to \$5,000. All other Applicants may qualify for the Standard Voucher of up to \$1,000. Program funds come from California Climate Investments, a statewide initiative that puts Cap-and-Trade dollars to work.

The program improves air quality and mitigates neighborhood impacts by reducing the amount of woodsmoke emitted from fireplaces and wood stoves in the county, which accounts for about 33 percent of wintertime particulate matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub> and PM<sub>10</sub>) emissions. In addition to particulate matter, woodsmoke contains soot, dioxins, carbon dioxide, and volatile organic compounds. Breathing woodsmoke can reduce lung function, aggravate heart and lung diseases, and trigger asthma. The program also achieves reductions in black carbon, a short-lived climate pollutant emitted when wood burns.
