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
Background

- 31 years of experience managing grants countywide
- Leveraged \$37 million in state and local funds
- Partnerships with public and private entities
- Secured several thousand tons of voluntary emission reductions
- Target mobile sources outside the District's regulatory authority

Carl Moyer Program (Year 20)

- \$9.8 M total grants for 172 projects (Ag/Off-Road/On-Road/Marine)
- Over 1,500 tons of emission reductions
- Fiscal Year 2018-19: \$517,512 committed to projects
 - \$417,512 for six (6) off-road equipment replacements
 - \$100,000 for one (1) marine engine repower
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$612,145 budgeted for Year 21 projects









FARMER Program (Year 1)

- Funding Agricultural Replacement Measures for Emission Reductions
- Fund off-road equipment replacement mobile agriculture projects
- \$583,538 total grants for five (5) off-road equipment replacements
- Over 25 tons of emission reductions
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$563,560 budgeted for Year 2 projects



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Cap and Trade Dollars at Wor

Community Air Protection Program (Year 1)

- Fund distribution within low income communities
- \$613,063 total grants for eight (8) projects
- Over 53 tons of emission reductions
- Fiscal Year 2018-19: one (1) marine engine repower; one (1) school bus replacement; six (6) off-road equipment replacements, including one (1) co-funded with Voluntary NOx Remediation funds
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$1,064,875 budgeted for Year 2 projects
- Seek Board approval for Year 2 funds in June

Voluntary NOx Remediation Measures Program

- CARB mitigation funds in response to increased NOx emissions from biodiesel as part of CARB's Low Carbon Fuel Standard regulation
- \$379,510 total cost for one (1) off-road mobile ag equipment replacement project co-funded with Community Air Protection (CAP) funds
 - \$90,142 Voluntary NOx funds + \$59,858 CAP Funds
 - Over 16 tons of emission reductions





Lower Emission School Bus Program (Year 18)

- \$3.4M in grant funds for 73 projects
 - 35 school bus replacements | 33 school bus retrofits
 - Four (4) CNG fuel tank replacements | One (1) CNG fuel hose replacement
- Fiscal Year 2018-19:
 - \$125,000 DMV Surcharge funds for Orcutt diesel bus replacement
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$300,000 budgeted for projects



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Old Car Buy Back Program (Year 20)

- \$7.8M in DMV Surcharge funds expended to retire 7,386 old vehicles
- 960 tons of emission reductions
- Three regional dismantlers: Goleta / Lompoc / Santa Maria
- \$1,250/vehicle (\$1,000 to owner; \$250 to dismantler)
- Model Year 1995 and older
- Fiscal Year 2018-19: \$308,750 expended to scrap 247 cars
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$700,000 budget






Electric Vehicle Charging Station Program (Year 8)

- \$282,137 total grants for 17 projects
- Fiscal Year 2018-19: \$67,196 committed to projects
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$100,000 budget
 - Public entities and any Multi-Unit Dwellings (20+ units)
 - Possibly seek future board approval to implement additional changes



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Woodsmoke Reduction Program (Year 1)

- \$224,000 of vouchers issued and committed to 61 projects
- \$180,000 total grants for 44 completed projects
- Fiscal Year 2019-20: \$250,000 CARB funds set as placeholder in budget
- Seek approval to receive Year 2 funds at August Board meeting
