

2021 CLEAN AIR GRANT PROGRAM

30-day application window

Opening in early August

- A successful project will be eligible to receive a grant within a range from \$10,000 to \$250,000 and not to exceed 80% of total eligible project cost.
- Grant amounts may vary based on the costeffectiveness, emission reductions, length of project, and fund availability.
