#### **DISTRICT OPERATIONS**

**Early Response** 

(March 11 – 13)

- Interagency Coordination (SBCOEM bi-weekly conf calls, CAPCOA weekly video calls)
- Surveyed staff's teleworking capacities
- Cancelled non-essential meetings & implemented informal travel ban

Office Closed to Public & Staff Teleworking

(March 16 – today)

- Closed APCD offices to walk-in visitors (3/18), majority of staff working remotely (3/23)
- Identified essential services that required staff to go in field, office or monitoring stations
- Defined safety practices for staff working outside of their home office (social distancing, PPE)
- Procedural changes to inspections and complaint response

Re-opening Plans

(under development

- Coordinating with all tenants of the Casa Nueva building
- Remote working will remain an ongoing practice of the Air District
- Work with Unions to ensure understanding of re-opening plans
- Soft re-opening likely within a month, full re-opening targeted in July; follow RISE guidelines




## REGULATORY RELIEF


- Case-by-case evaluation of requests for regulatory relief
- Electronic submittal of permit applications and asbestos notifications
- Case-by-case evaluation of requests for changes to in-person inspections
  - At a minimum, remote inspections and records review
- Payment plans for regulated facilities that demonstrate economic hardship for NOV settlements and outstanding invoices
- Expedited permits for projects related to the COVID-19 response effort
- Extend voluntary incentive program contract terms for the purchase of new equipment
- Provide enhanced remote participation in public workshops and meetings

# AIR QUALITY SUMMARY

#### **AQI Current Year vs. Prior Years**

- Average AQI improved 12% in 2020 compared to prior 5 year average
  - 53 Good days in 2020 vs. 40 days in 2015 19
  - 9 Moderate days in 2020 vs. 22 days in 2015 19

 Ozone continues to lead the highest AQI values in 2020 as it has in prior years



#### It's Official!!!

The California Office of **Administrative** Law took action earlier in May and approved Santa **Barbara County's** attainment for the ozone standard.



Santa Barbara County is now one of only 6 regions in California to reach attainment of the ozone standard. Most notable, our region is in the middle of the South Central Coast region, which has a higher population and greater number of industrial sources than the attainment regions in northern California.
